## A LEGACY OF FAITH & EDUCATION: THE MCLOUGHLIN FAMILY

Kevin and Megan McLoughlin are devoted parents at Our Lady of the Lake Catholic and have deep roots in the school's history and a commitment to its values. Their family ties to our school, coupled with their personal experiences, have made Our Lady of the Lake a cherished part of their lives.

Family values are at the forefront of the school's culture. The importance of this family dynamic was evident during a recent personal tragedy. "The outpouring of love and support from our school community was tremendous," Mrs. McLoughlin shares. "From impromptu prayer services, notes, cards, kind gestures, small gifts, compassionate words – we felt lifted up in prayer. Knowing that others shared our grief made a horrific time more bearable."

Kevin and Megan lead by example in supporting their school. Their contributions extend beyond financial support – they generously offer their time and talents to help OLL excel. Kevin serves on the OLL Advisory Board and Megan plays a vital role on the Dr. John Proos Laker Athletic Golf Classic committee, which raised \$67,500 for Laker athletics this year. They both can be found helping in the classroom, assisting with after school activities and coaching sports teams. Their dedication ensures that OLL remains a haven for students to grow academically, spiritually, and as responsible faith-filled citizens.

# Dr. John Proos Laker Athletic Golf Class C

The 31st Annual Dr. John Proos Laker Athletic Golf Classic occurred on Friday, August 18th, at Harbor Shores Golf Club. Thirty-three teams (132 golfers) teed off in support of our student-athletes (elementary through varsity). Teams enjoyed a delicious, boxed lunch sponsored by Bread+Bar, competed in on-course games sponsored by K & M Machine Fabricating, Freedom Boat Club, and LeValley Chevrolet Buick and GMC, and wrapped up with a cocktail hour at the 19th Hole hosted by The PGA of America. The golfers all received new Our Lady of the Lake umbrellas courtesy of Jungle Jane Promotions and custom bag tags made by Irish Woodworks. The Golf Classic raised OVER \$67,500 for all Laker Athletics and gym improvements, including a new floor, lighting, and soon-to-have new bleachers!

This year, the school received a matching grant of \$75,000 from an anonymous donor to add to the total for gym upgrades.





## **EDUCATION**

Our Lady of the Lake Catholic School provides a traditional Catholic education in a culture of academic excellence. Our teachers are among the finest in the area, skilled at bringing out the best in their students and modeling Catholic culture in their classrooms. And, because of your generosity, we are able to offer robust programming, opportunities and experiences that you just can't find elsewhere.



The OLL Makerspace will be utilized by all students in the building, Preschool - 5th grade. Students in grades K - 5 will have Makerspace as a content class beginning next school year. Mrs. Lindsey Goshgarian, who has participated in numerous professional development opportunities and training, will be the Maker Master and teach the weekly class. Equipment will include a Glowforge Laser Cutter/Engraver, 3D printers, circuits and bots, a Lego station, software, engineering and electrical packs, and many, many handson tools and maker materials, all of which is housed full-time at OLL.





Research shows that hands-on learning is the BEST way to learn and gain new skills, and we believe that the best place to do that is in a Makerspace. Makerspaces matter because they: provide students with hands-on experiences, solve real-world problems, reinforce core academic content, teach technical skills through experience, give students ownership over their own learning, and encourage collaboration and problem-solving."


Thanks to the generous contributions of the LMCSF and the Liotine Family, the school was able to purchase new state-of-the-art Chromebooks. These devices have replaced older models in our middle and high school classrooms, providing students with the latest tools for conducting reliable research and using essential applications. With these new additions, we can now ensure that the knowledge gained by students in elementary school is consistently built upon throughout their academic career. These Chromebooks are a valuable addition to our existing technologies such as SMART Boards, projectors, and audio-visual equipment, making it easier for students to learn and teachers to teach.

#### **SAT SCORES**



The AP® School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening access. Schools can earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to increasing college-going culture, providing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and maximizing college readiness.

Our Lady of the Lake Catholic School had 70.5% of high school students in grades 10-12 enroll in an AP class and take the AP exam. 69.2% of the 2023 test takers scored a three or higher on at least one AP exam. The OLL AP pass rate (students scoring a 3 or higher) has increased by over 30% since 2019. OLL had 12 AP Scholars for this year's AP administration!

For Our Lady of the Lake students, catechesis and faith formation are important parts of the education journey.

Christ should be the ultimate goal for students and staff, and to ensure that this remains the primary focus, Our Lady of the Lake Catholic School continues to cultivate a robust retreat program.

The program begins in sixth grade with a class trip to Camp Friedenswald and culminates in the Senior SPRITZ Retreat during the first week of Senior year. Each subsequent retreat builds upon the lessons learned from the prior year, with an emphasis on fostering a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through growing in an intentional community with one another.

This is achieved through activities such as small group discussions, receiving the Sacraments, praying in Adoration with Benediction, games, and service. As a Catholic School, we have the responsibility of evangelizing the faith to our students and the local community. Our primary objective is to help students and staff grow in authentic holiness that will sustain them throughout life and impact those they encounter. Therefore, continuing to enhance the retreat program at OLL is one of the best ways to achieve this goal.

Every summer, a group of dedicated students embarked on a mission trip to Batey 106 in the Dominican Republic. They constructed houses for the underprivileged and helped in educational efforts, making a profound difference in the lives of the local families. This experience instilled in them a global perspective, reminding them of the importance of generosity and compassion on a global scale.

Another project close to their hearts was visiting the Whitcomb Tower, a local retirement home. The residents at Whitcomb eagerly awaited the students' visits, where they played games, shared stories, and brightened the seniors' days. For the young volunteers, these encounters taught them the priceless gift of time, companionship, and the wisdom that comes with age.

During the holiday season, students participate in the 'Cookies for First Responders' tradition. Students, teachers, and parents gathered to bake and decorate an abundance of Christmas cookies. After finishing their creations, they

embarked on a joyous journey to the Police and Fire Station. With plates of cookies in hand, they spread holiday cheer, expressing their gratitude for the tireless work the first responders did throughout the year.

In addition to these significant projects, Our Lady of the Lake students also engaged in various local initiatives. Roadside cleanups, St. Joseph Today events, and a host of other activities connected them with their community. They adopted families from the Readiness Center for Christmas, organized book drives, and hosted Easter egg hunts for the children. Each project was an opportunity for the students to learn and grow, teaching them the values of kindness and community engagement.

Students also volunteered at events like the Steelhead Triathlon, and the Fit4Fall 5k, the Leco Race. The proceeds from these races often went to support charitable organizations like Berrien Cancer Services.


